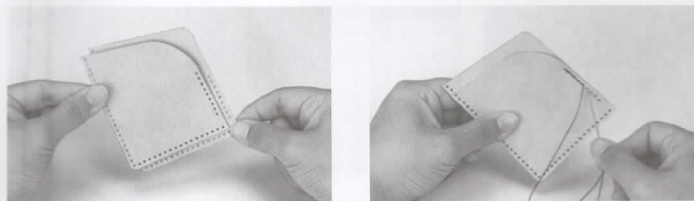
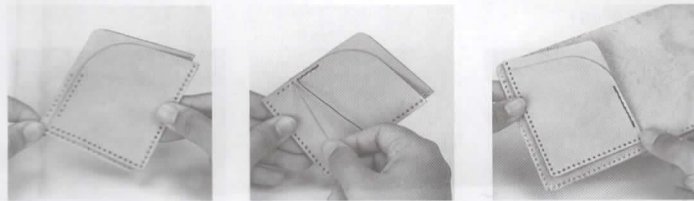


STEP-BY-STEP ASSEMBLY

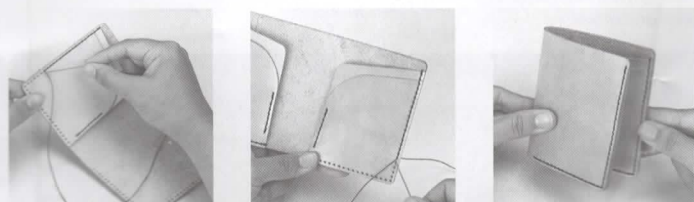


Step 1.
Stack the left front and back card holders, aligning the holes, and sew the inner sides together.



Step 2.
Sew the right front and back card holders in the same way to secure them.

Step 3.
Place the left card holder against the back side of the outer layer.



Step 4.
Align the surrounding stitching holes and sew to secure.

Step 5.
Align and sew the right card holder in the same manner.

Step 6.
Complete.

VEG-TAN LEATHER 101

Vegetable-tanned (veg-tan) leather is a natural, durable material that develops a rich patina over time. Tanned using plant-based extracts, it has a distinct look and feel, making it ideal for tooling, stamping, and dyeing. Its surface, known as **the grain side, is smooth and refined, typically used as the outer layer in leather goods. The rougher flesh side faces inward**, adding structure while remaining unseen. Veg-tan leather's unique aging process and versatility make it a favorite for crafting durable, personalized leather pieces.

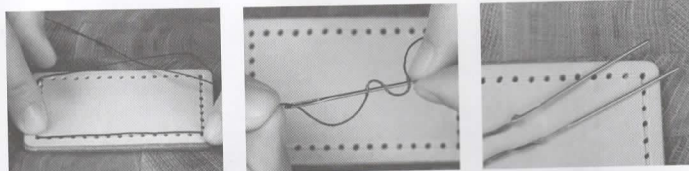
Leather pieces, 2 needles, threads



TOOLS REQUIREMENT

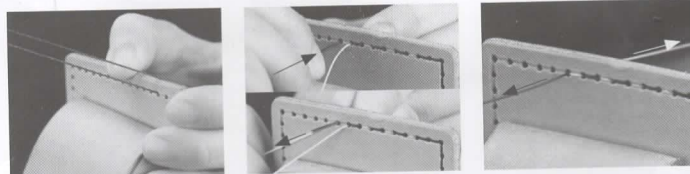
Scissors

SADDLE STITCHING INSTRUCTION



1. Prepare Your Thread
Measure the thread by multiplying the seam length by 2.5. (Use less than 3 feet of thread to avoid tangling.)

2. Thread Your Needles
Thread each end of the thread through a needle, pull 2 inches through, and loop it back into the thread to lock it in place.



3. Start Stitching
Hold your leather securely or use a stitching pony. Start at the furthest hole, pulling the thread so it's even on both sides.

4. Continue Stitching
Insert the left needle through the next hole, pull the thread tight, and repeat with the right needle. Continue this pattern until the end of the seam.



5. Backstitch to Secure
Reverse the stitch for 2-3 stitches to lock the seam and prevent unraveling.

6. Trim the Thread
Cut the thread close to the leather with a sharp blade.
